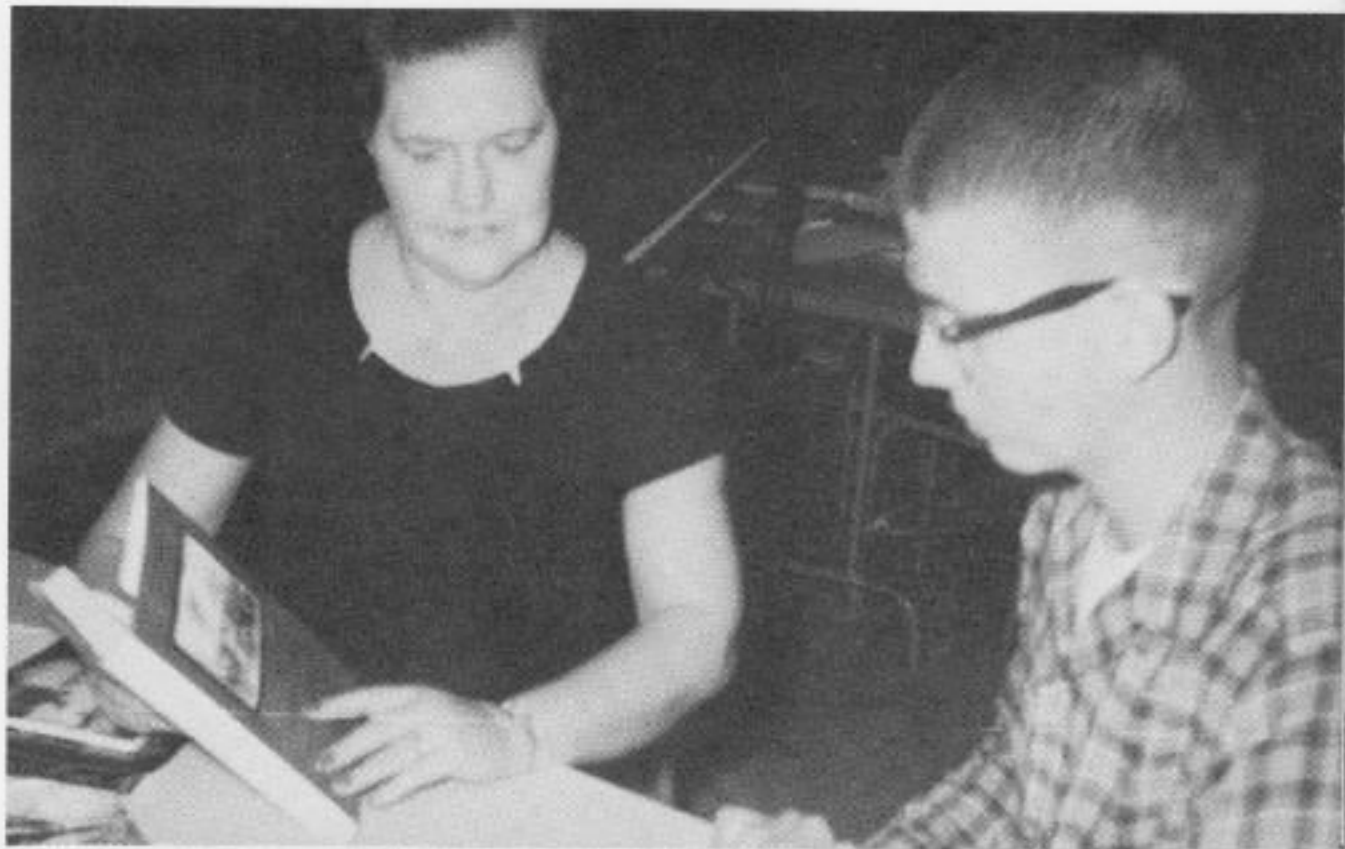

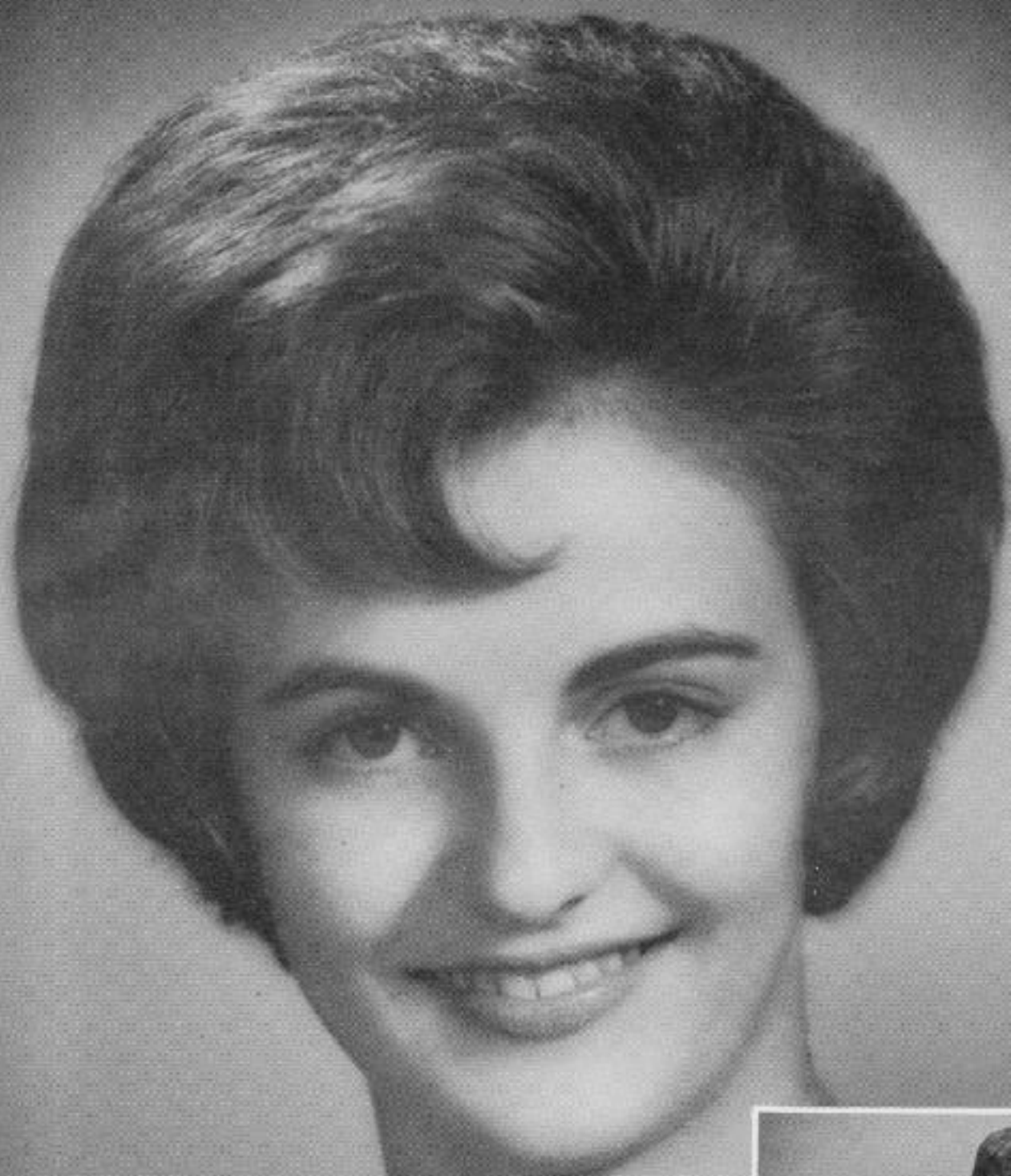
Thank you so much for the photographs of the boys and girls vying to be chosen your school's yearbook favorites.
