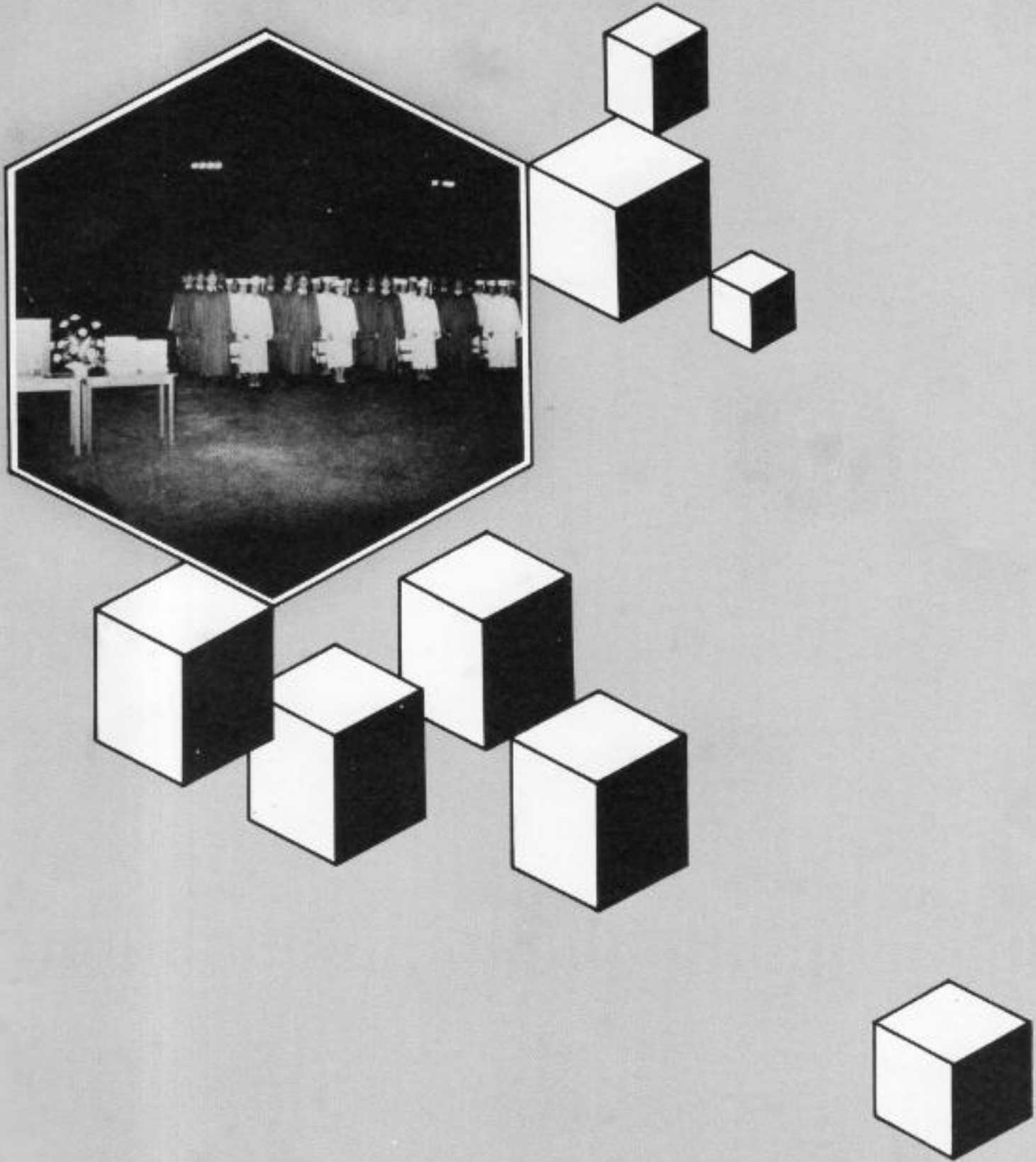

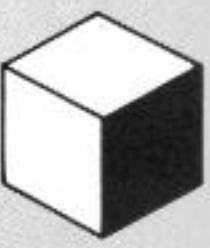

Boys study agriculture in this building.



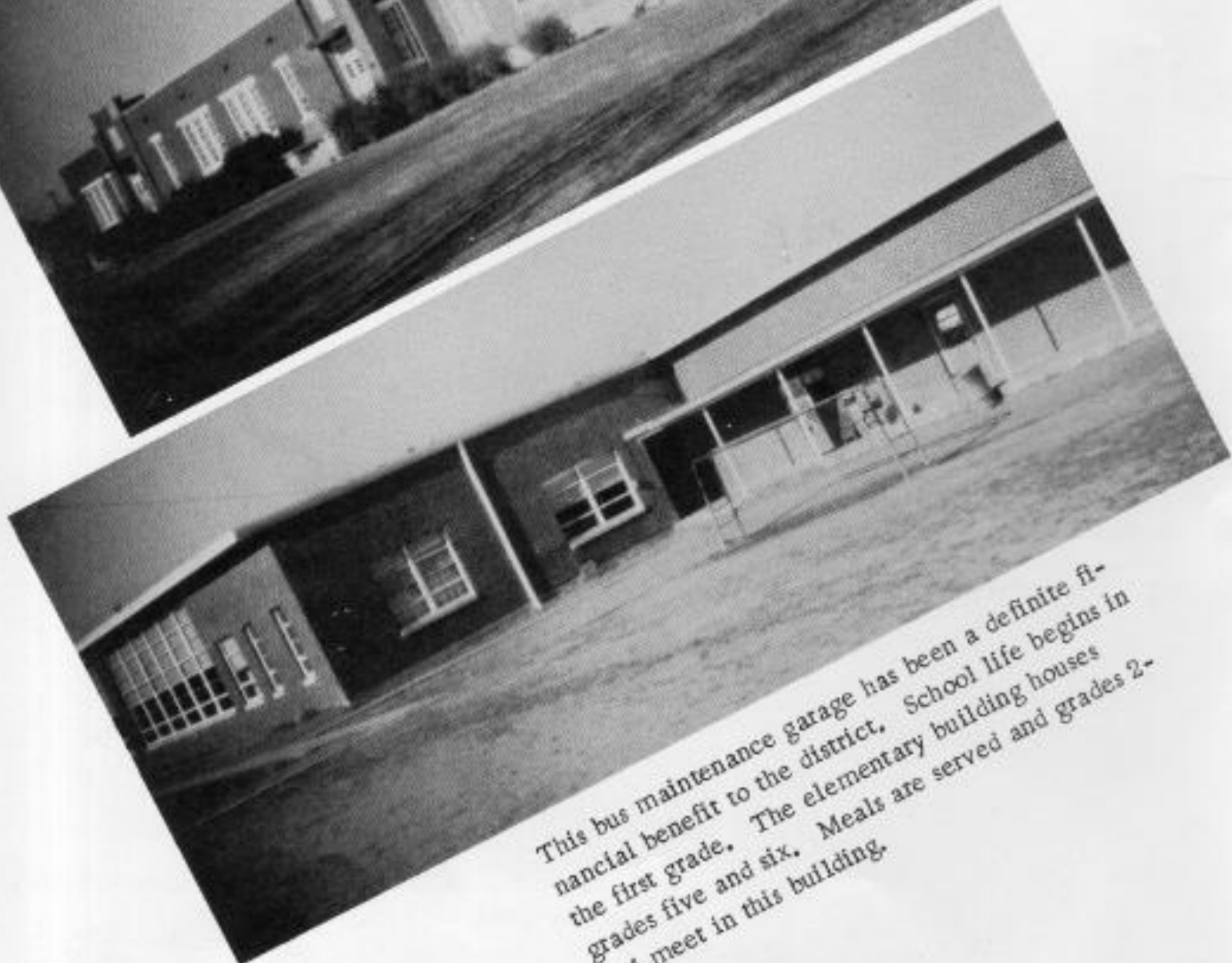
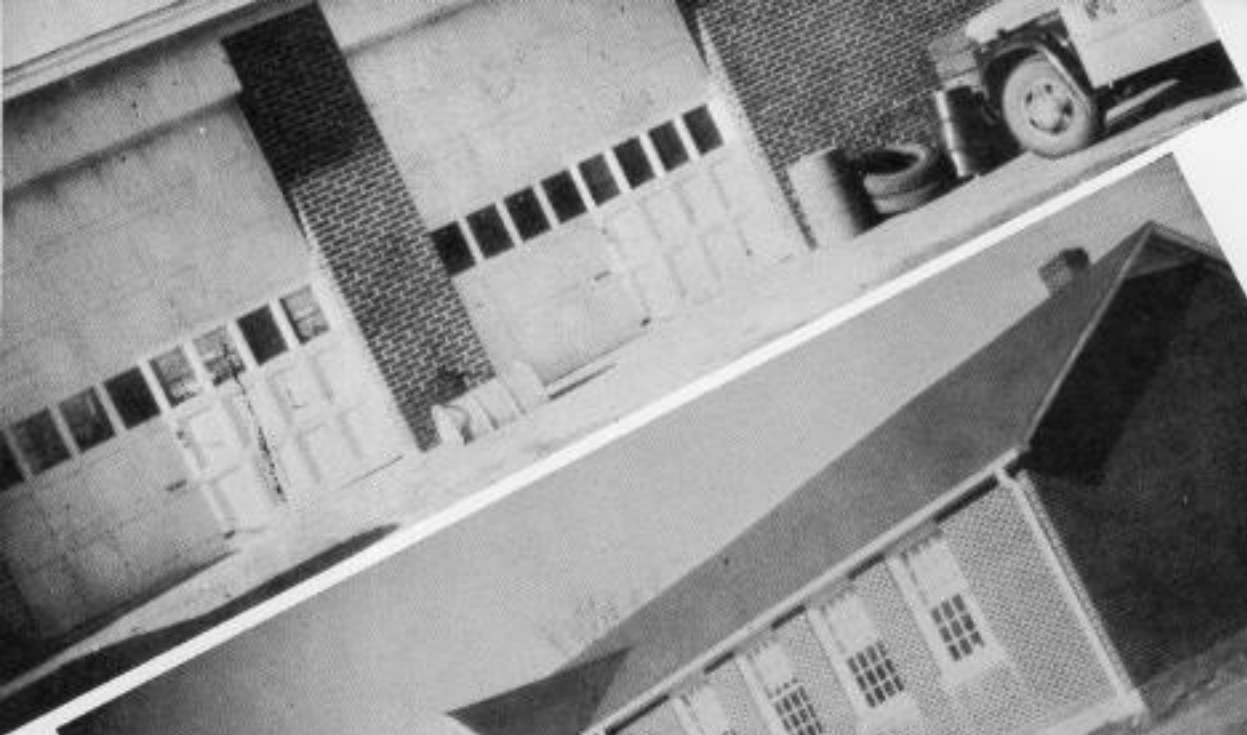
This gym was constructed in 1935 and has been in constant use since that time.



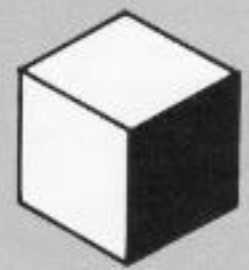
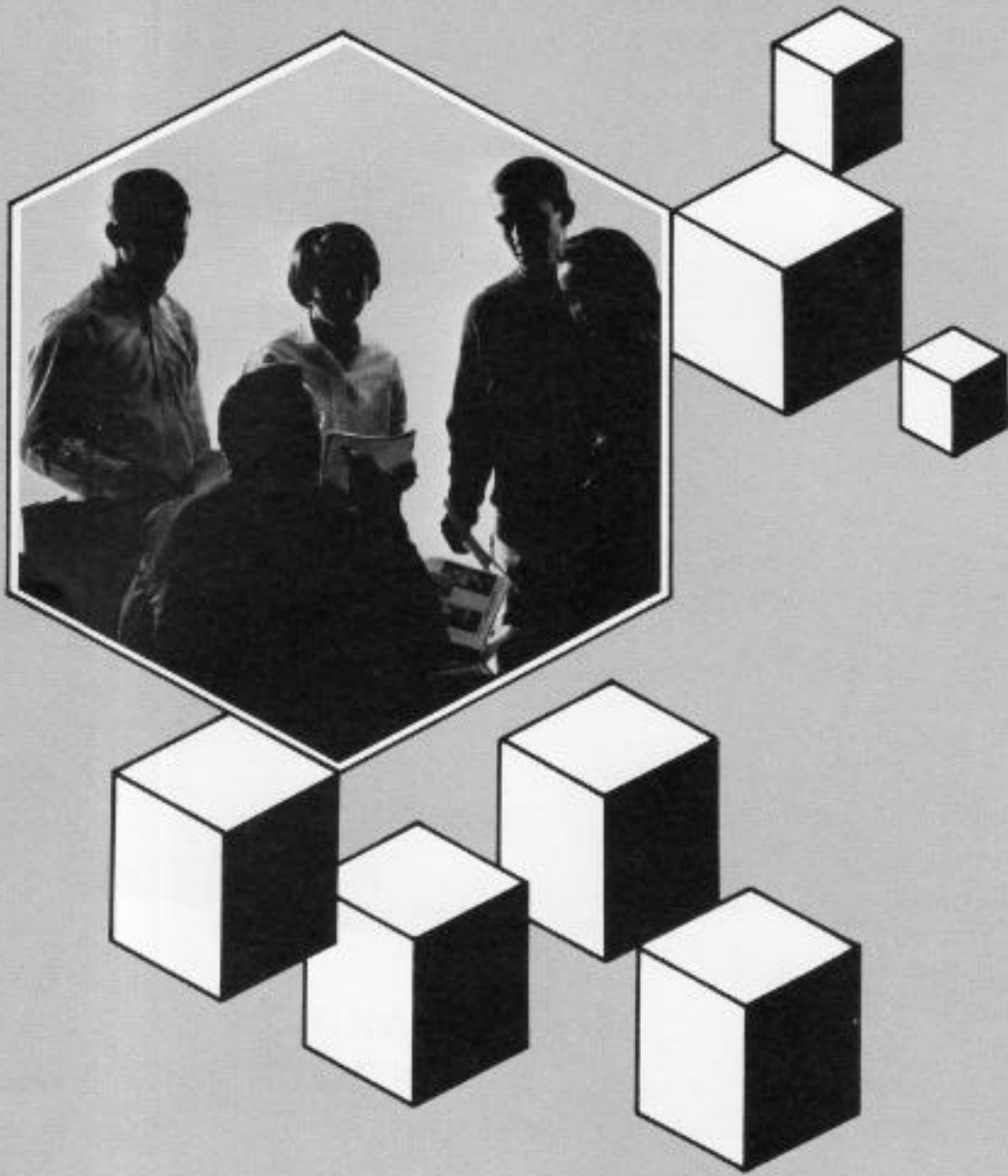
As one approaches the school campus from the down-town area, the junior high building furnishes an attractive approach to school facilities.

Regularly monthly meetings of the board are scheduled and the Hughes School District has moved forward under their leadership. This year a new gymnasium is being constructed on the Hughes School campus.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

ROY L. STOBAUGH



Being superintendent of Hughes Special District No. 27 is a full time job for an educator and a business man. This person must assume responsibility for educating 2782 students. Eighty-four teachers are employed and 40 non-teaching persons. He handles a monthly payroll of \$28,000 and is directly responsible for a budget of \$500,000 annually. As transportation supervisor he is the operator of 24 buses which made runs daily. With his school board he is the biggest business man in this community.

Mr. Stobaugh is a graduate of Arkansas State Teachers College and holds an MA degree from Memphis State University. He is past president of the Hughes Rotary Club, a steward in the Methodist Church, past member of AEA board, member of advisory council on secondary education, member of PTA, NEA, AEA, Schoolmasters, and is treasurer of Area 7 Athletic Association and past president of District 3B Athletic Association.

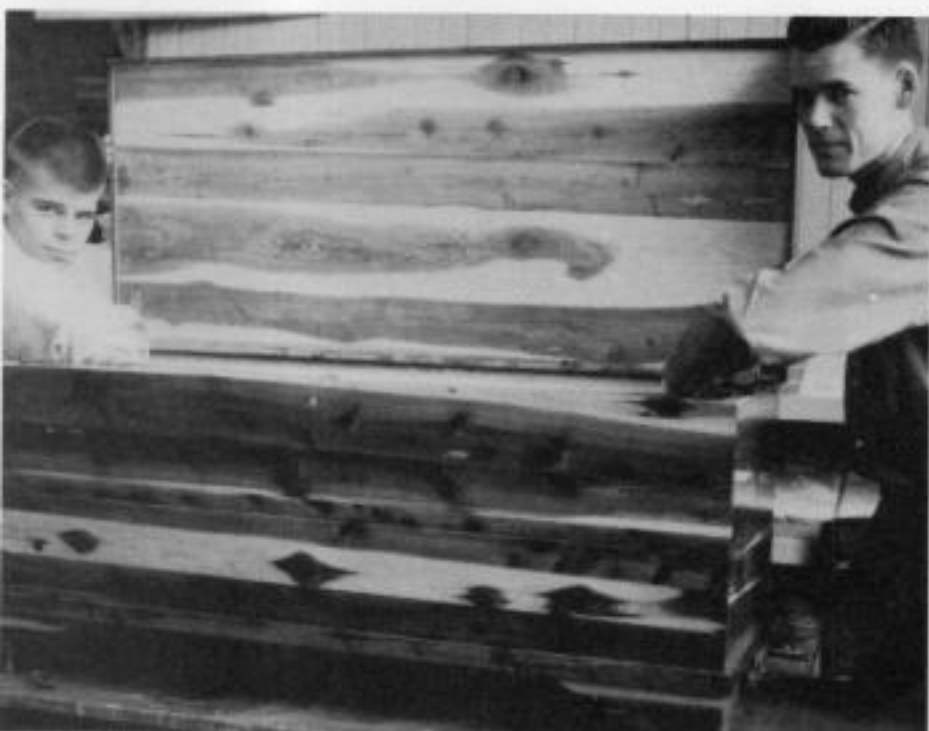

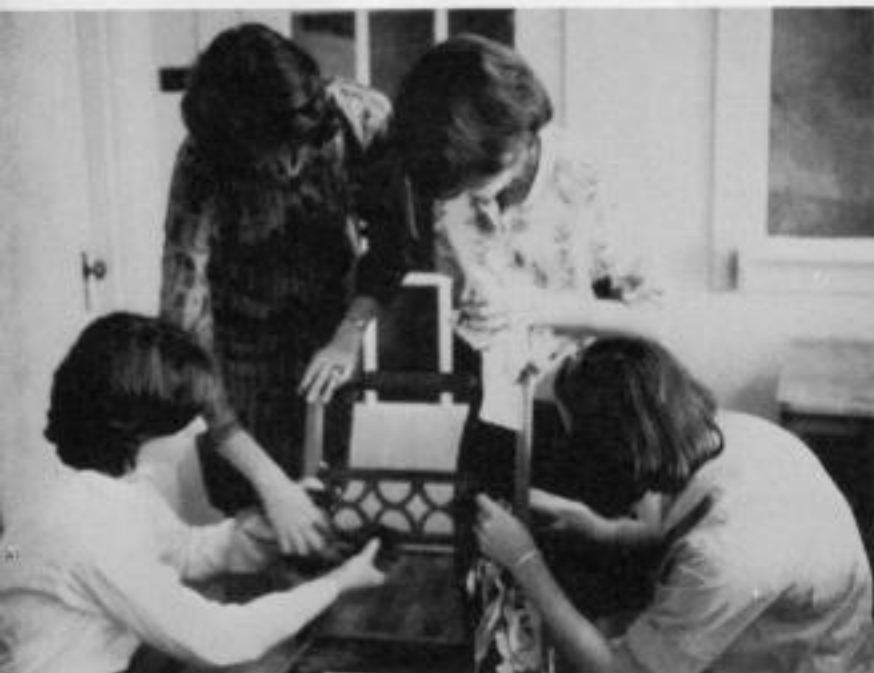
