Billy Lofton, Wayne Bailey, Mitchell Null, and Billy Ray Bryant set new records in the mile relay also.

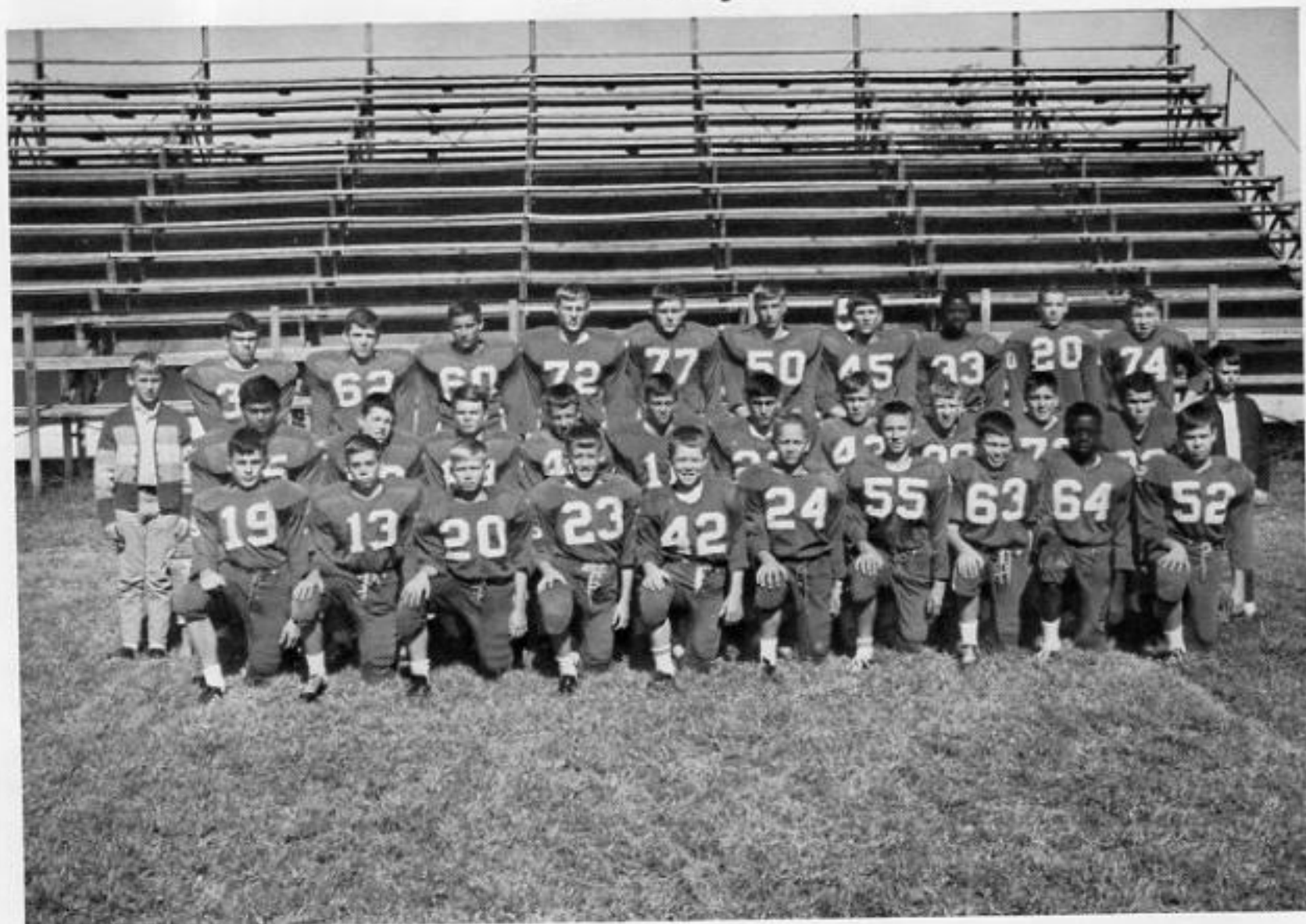
Null won the 100 yard dash and the 220 yard dash. He set a new record in the quarter mile also.
