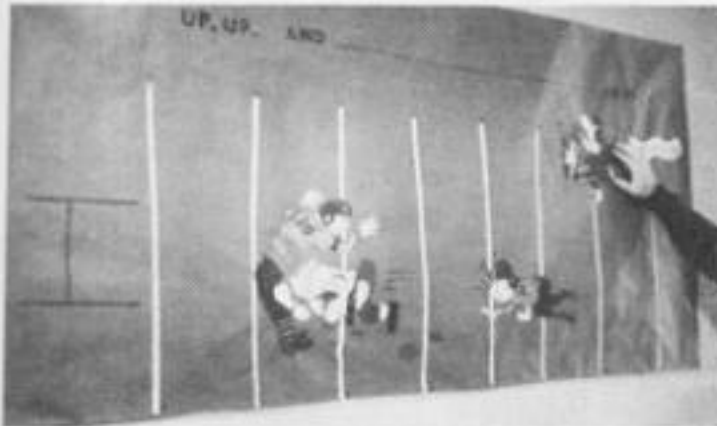
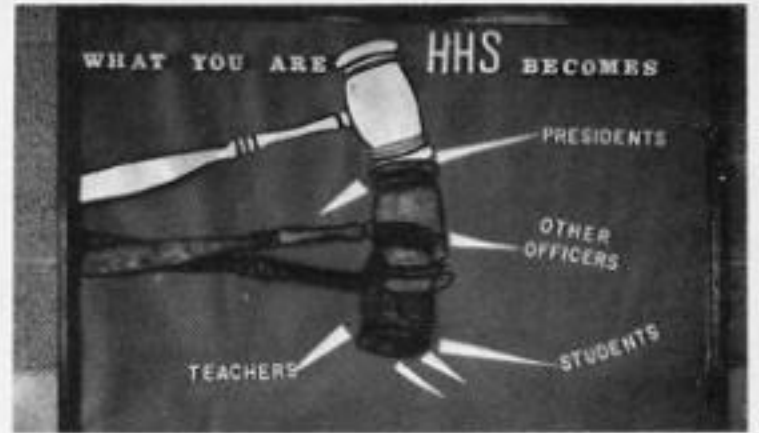

OUR CAMPUS



Here is the newest building on the Hughes School campus - a science building. This eleven-acre campus is the home of twelve grades of school. As you begin your tour of the campus, you pass the tennis courts and recently constructed new gymnasium. Classes for physical education are also held in the next building - the old gym.

Then the classroom instruction begins with the agri building. Behind this is located the transportation headquarters. Adjacent to the agriculture building you find a junior high building to the front and a senior high building located directly behind it.

A few steps over on the campus and in the center of the school site is the administration building. Located directly behind it is the home economics cottage and then the science building.

As we move west we begin a tour of the grade school. The fifth and sixth grades are housed in the first building, and directly behind this is the cafeteria building which is also the home of the second, third, and fourth grades. On the far end of the campus is the first grade building and grade school reading lab.

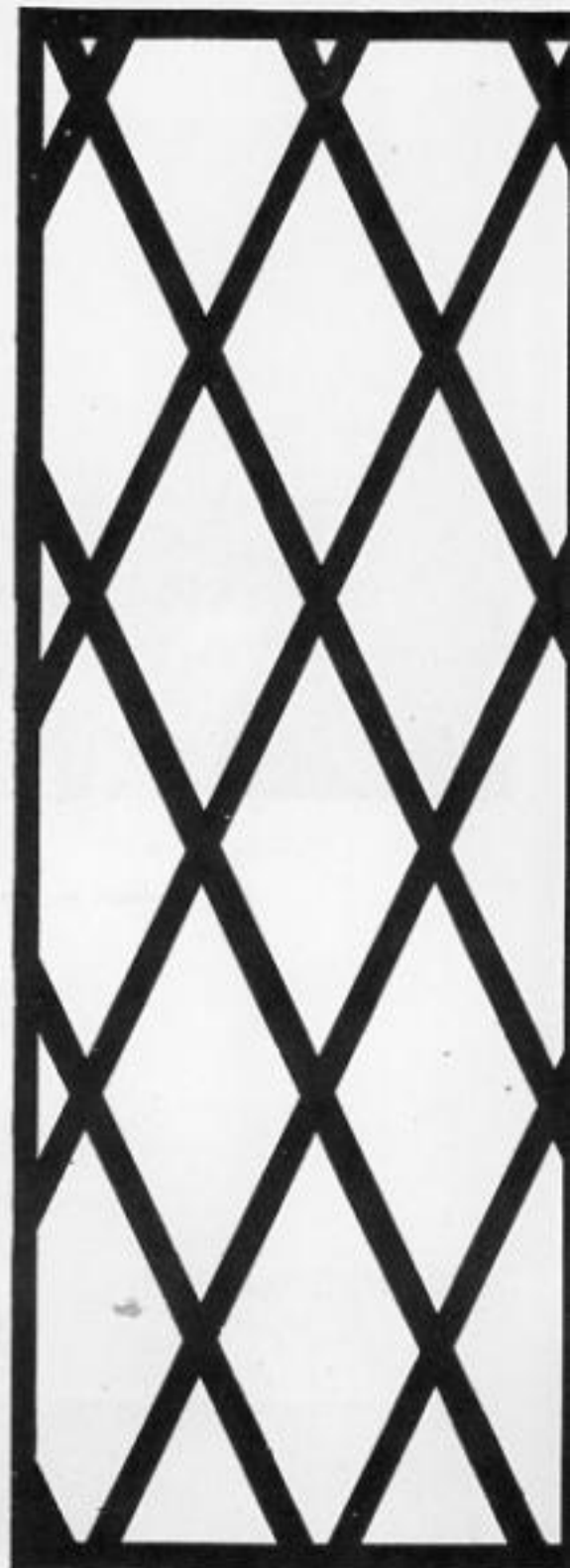
On the south side on the campus is the football field, home of the BLUE DEVILS.
