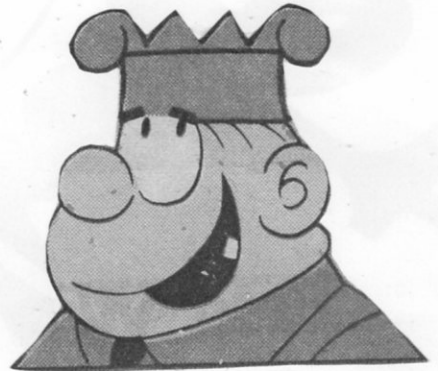

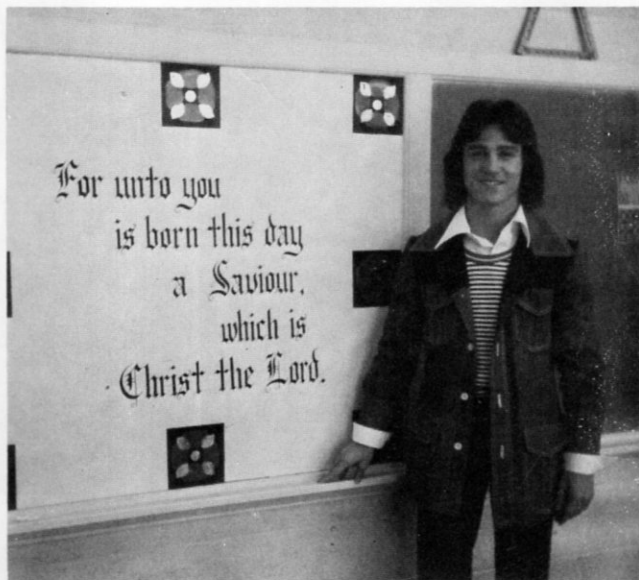

Education is big business and these are the men responsible for the operation of this business in Hughes School District.

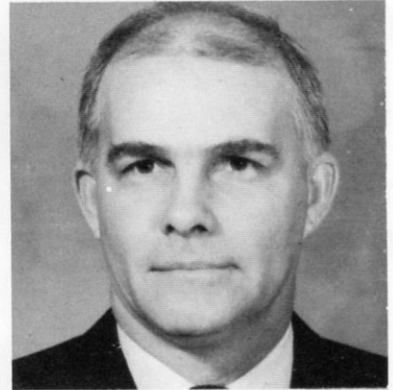
This district is composed of 248 square miles and is located in the southern part of St. Francis County and in the south half of Crittenden County.
