A Backward Look

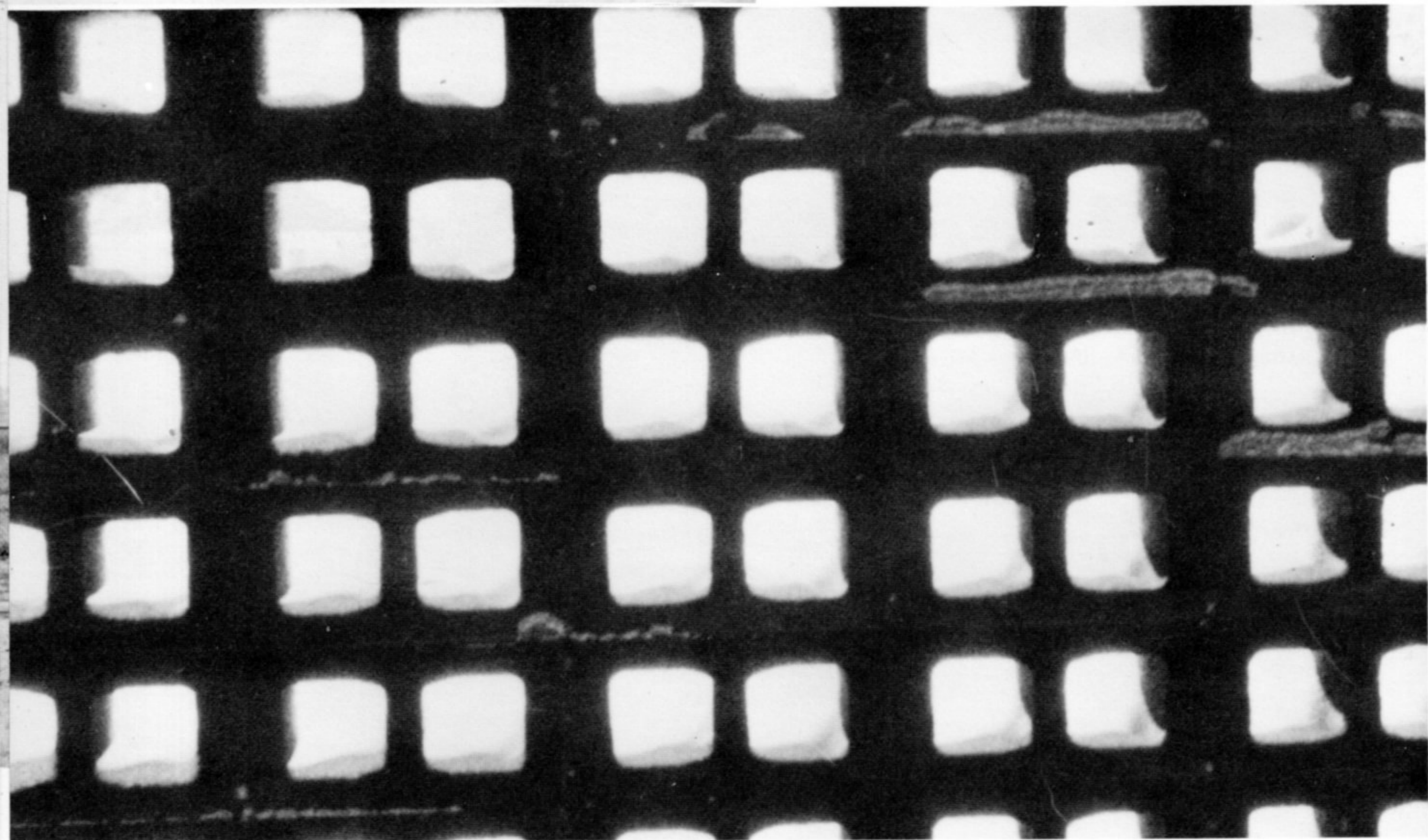

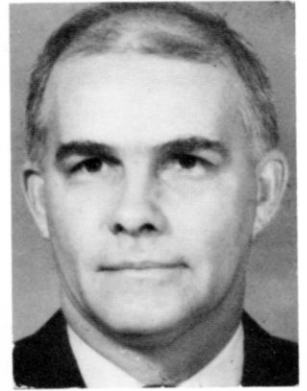

Eight men make up the Hughes Board of Education. They are dedicated to the education of every child in the Hughes School District.

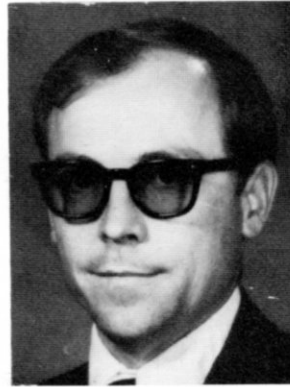
Their philosophy might be summed up in these words:

This awesome task means once a month meetings and a lot of extra hours of thought and work.



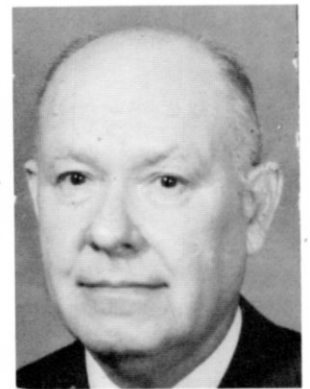

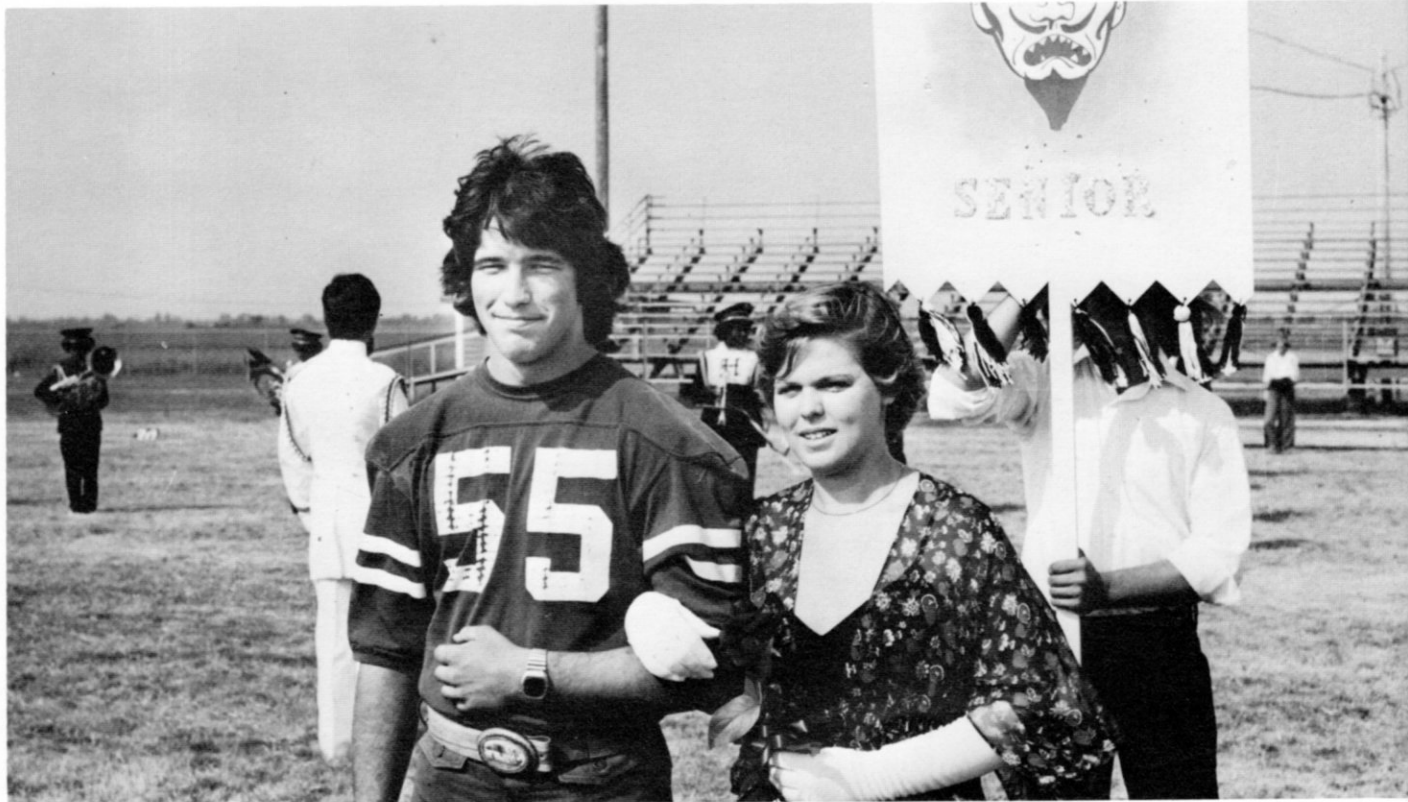

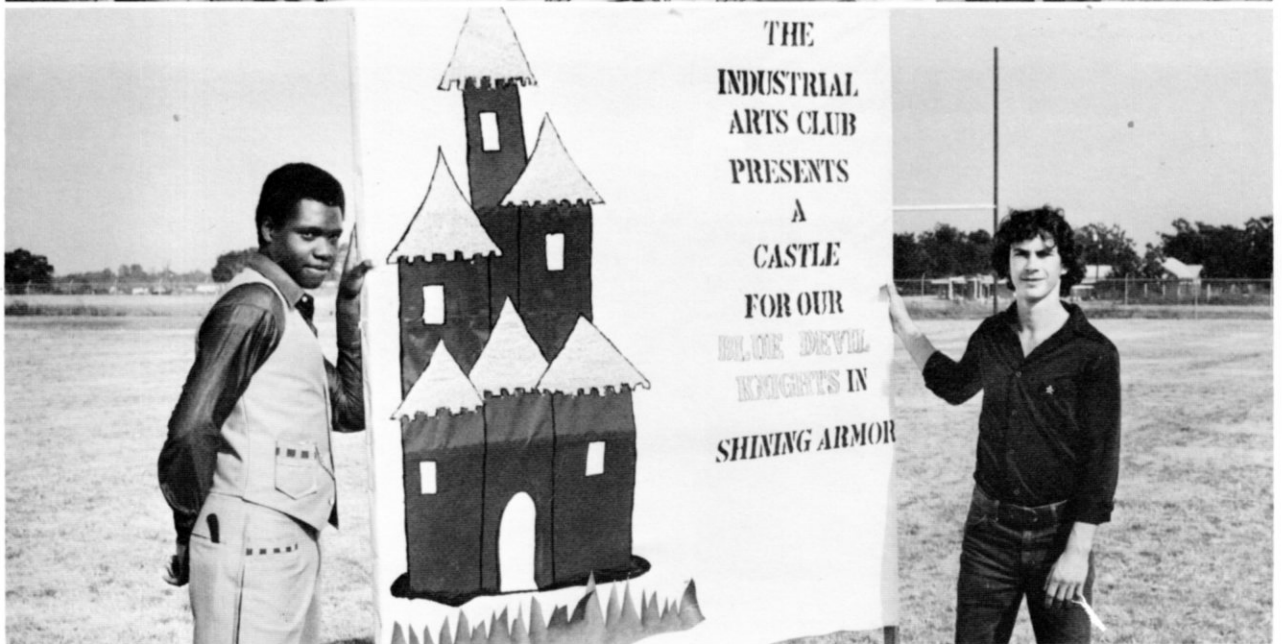

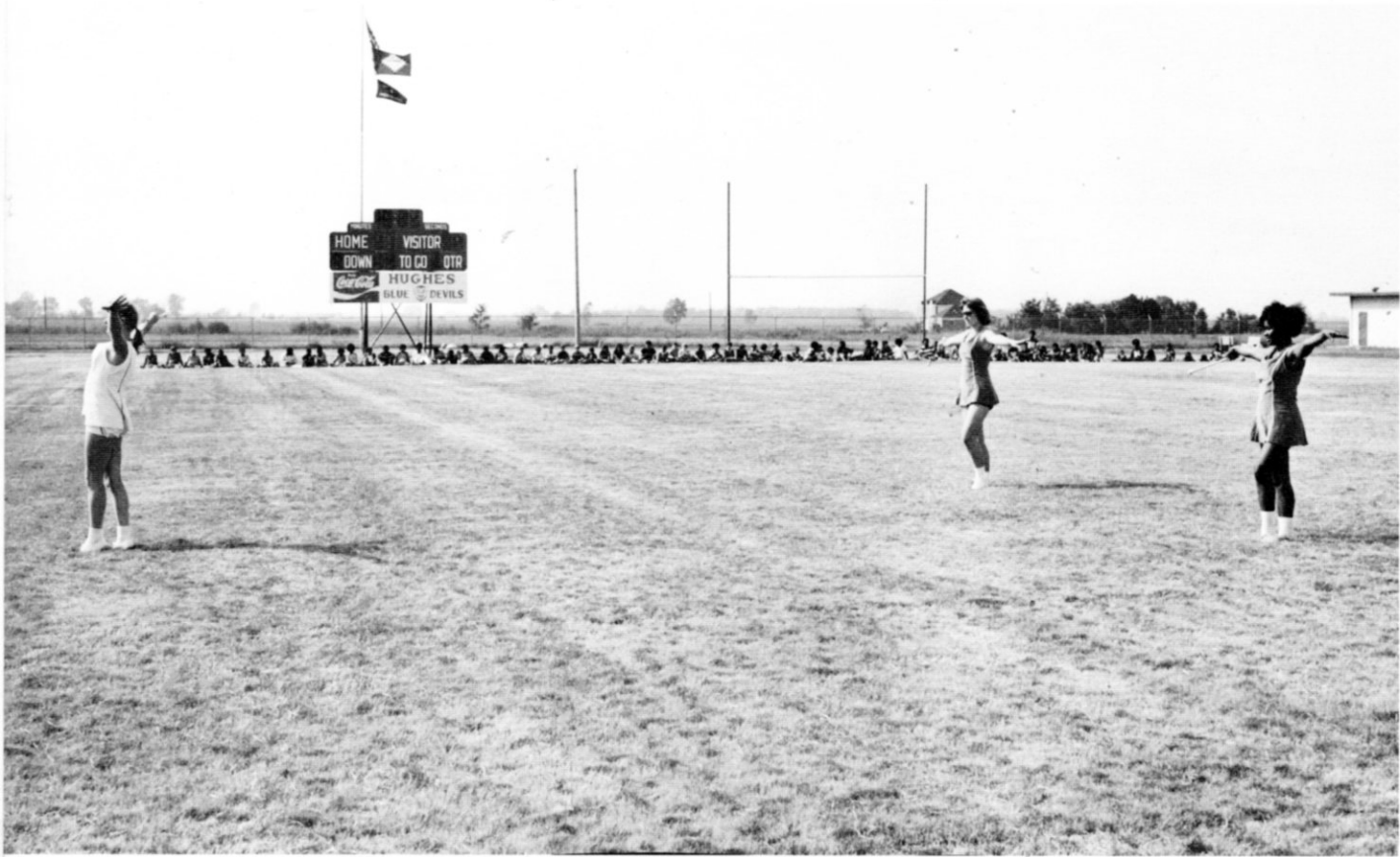
