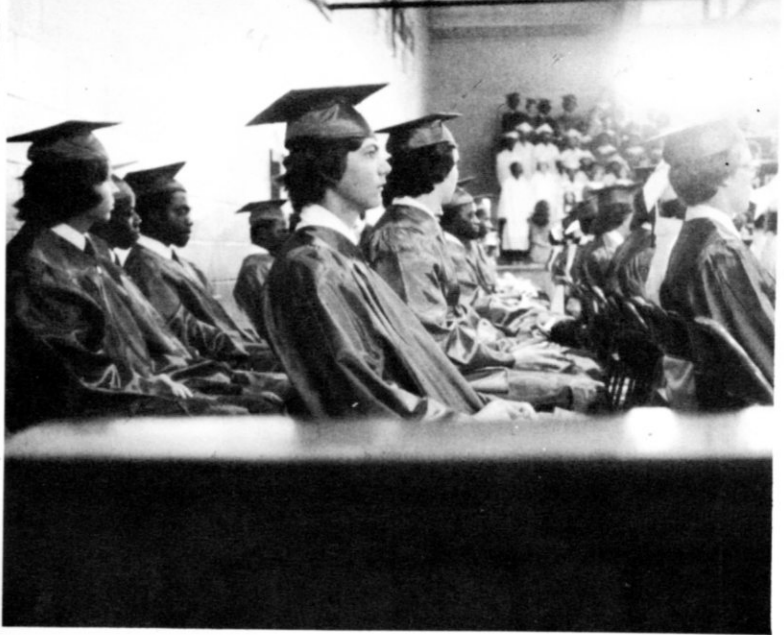


We Remember When . . .

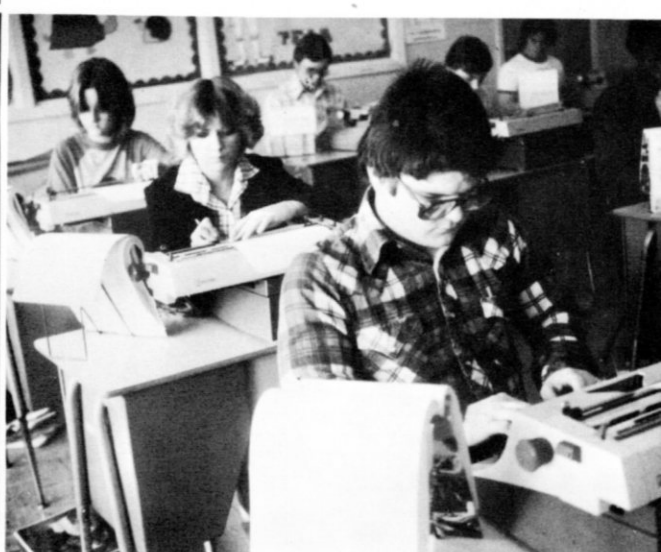

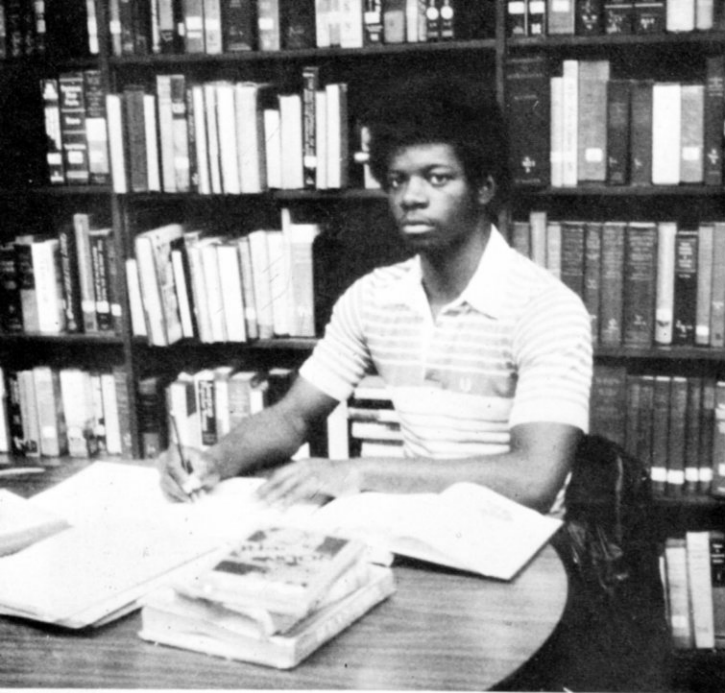
WE REMEMBER WHEN . . .

Everyone who ever took typing can remember those days when they were "all thumbs" and to type "asdf" was just like typing a six page report perfectly.

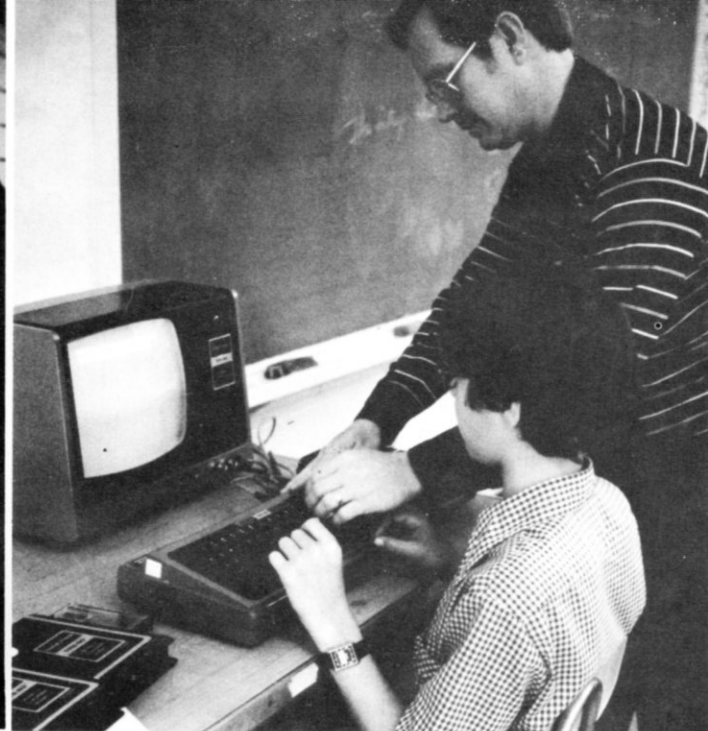
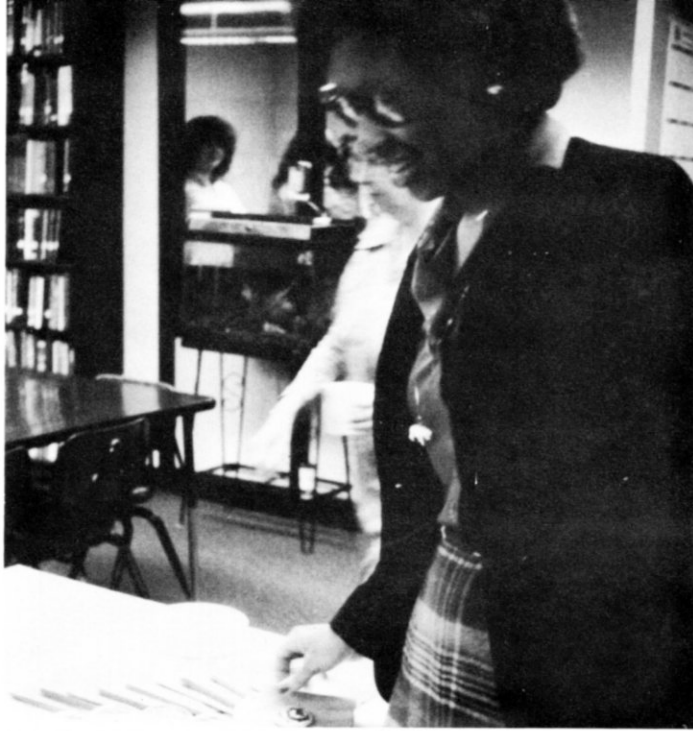

We recall the days when geometry meant such creative activities as doing Christmas drawing, string art, and other geometry projects.

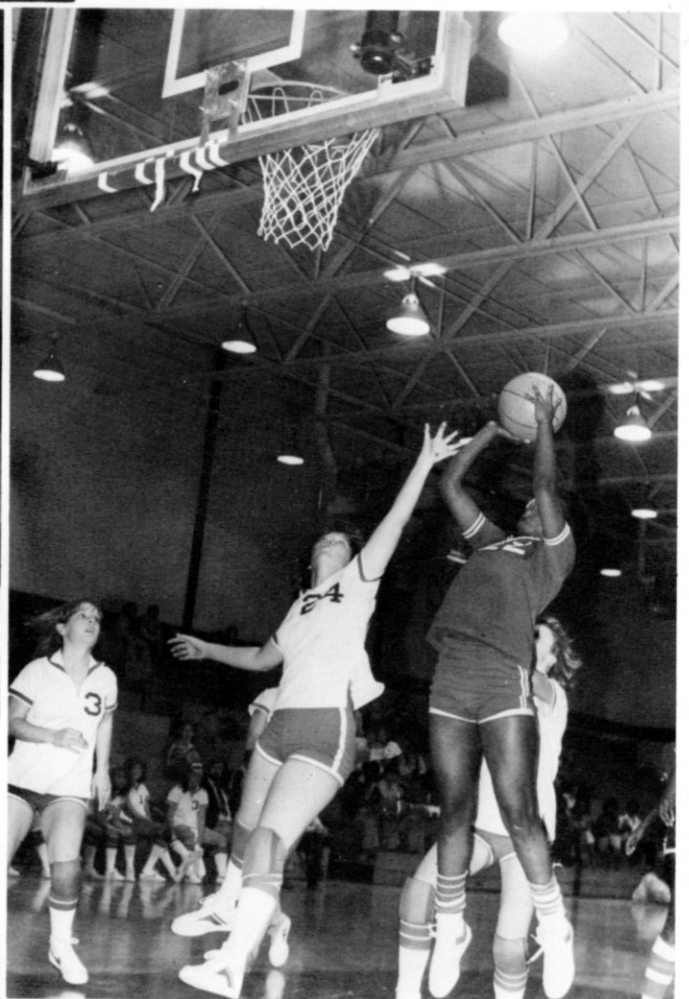
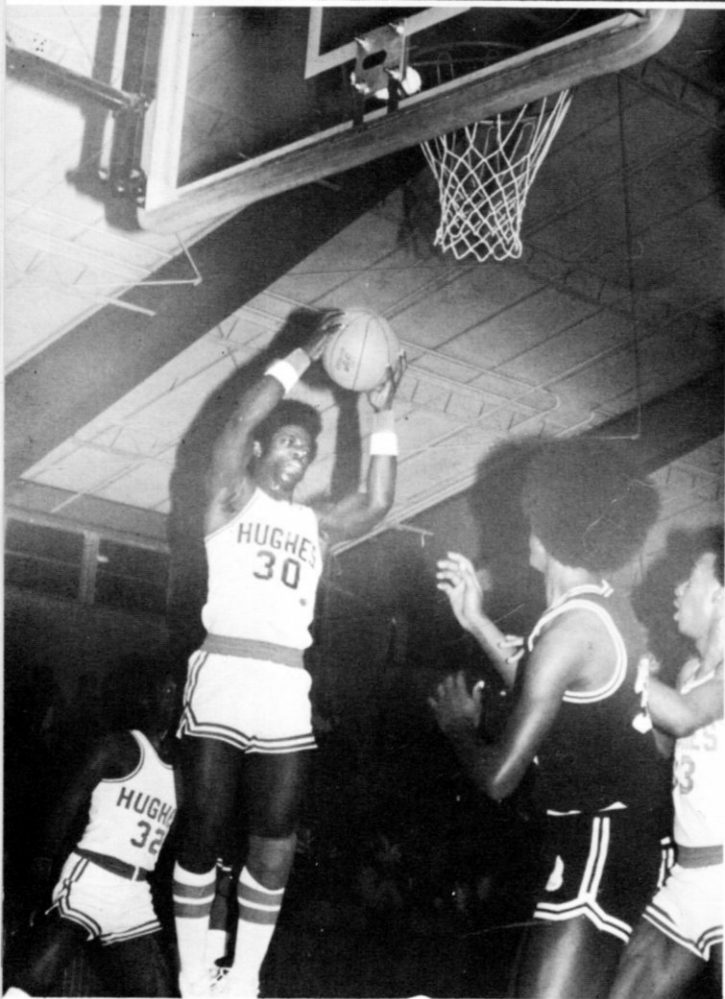

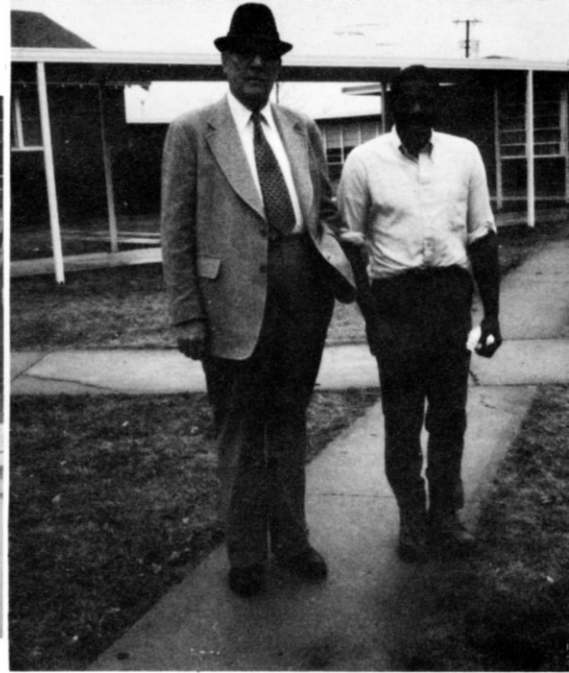


WHO WE REMEMBER . . .
