Each spring one of the highlights of the year is the Industrial Arts, Art, Math, Spanish, Home Economics Show. Students have their outstanding work on display.



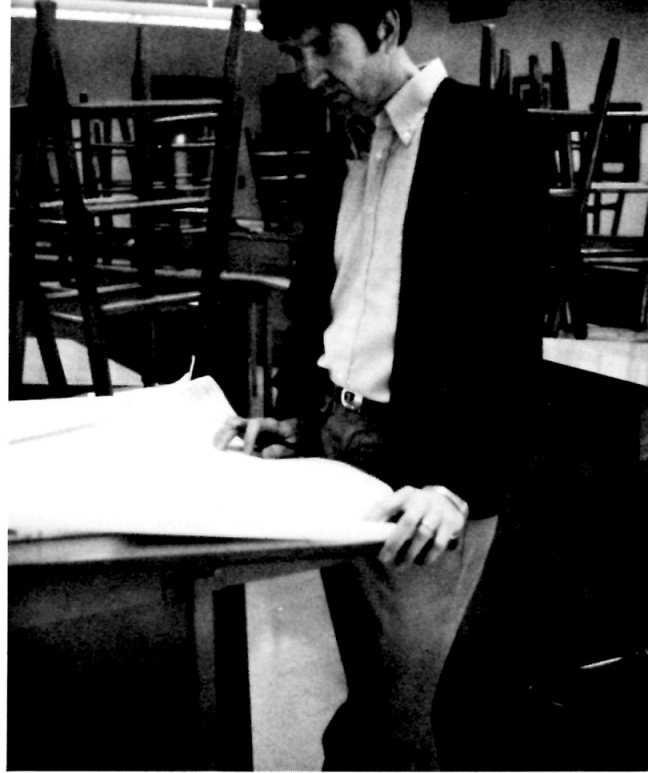
Top Right: A highlight of late May is the annual Awards Day assembly when medals, trophies, and other recognition awards are given. A four year-letterman receives a blanket.

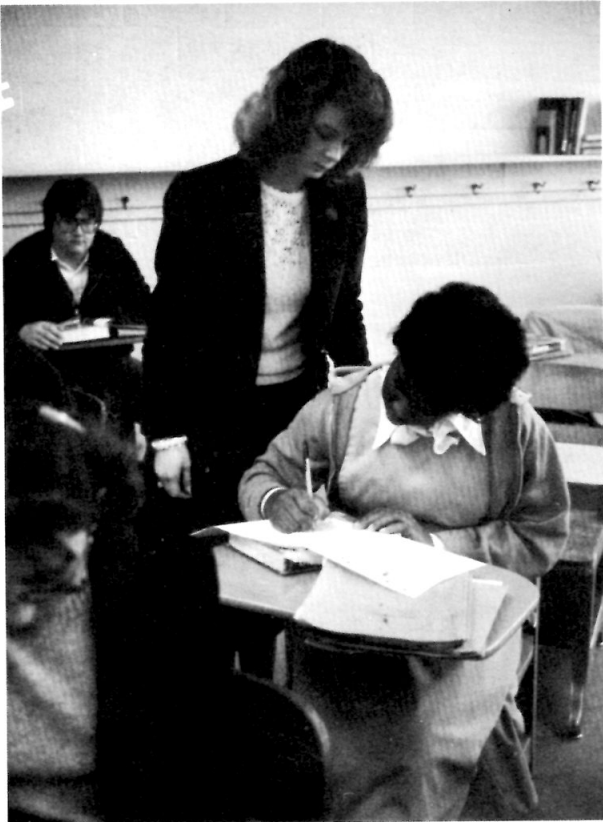

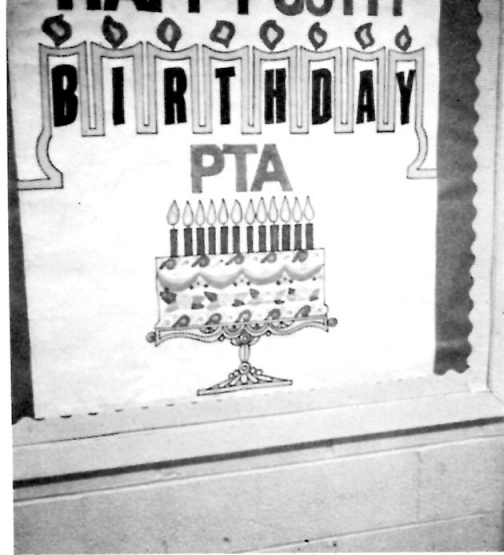

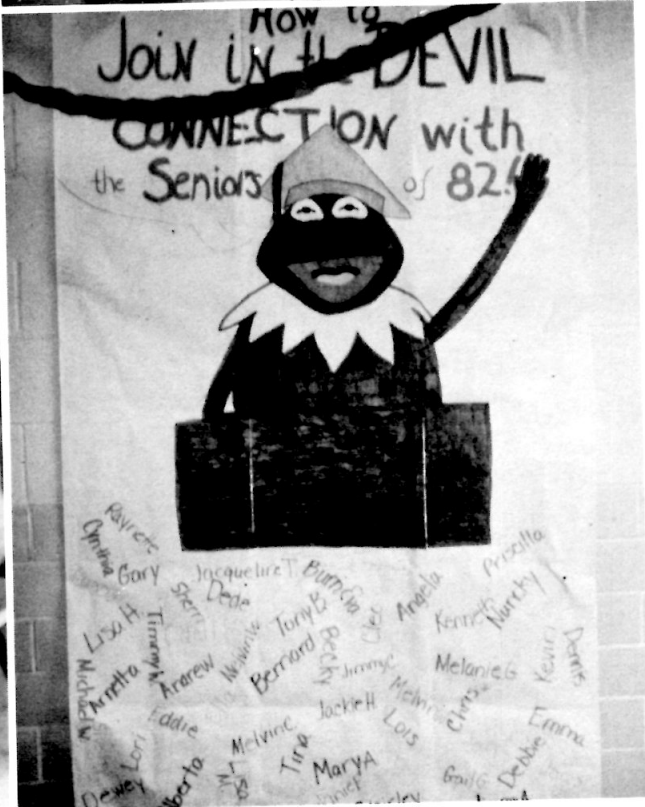

Three times during the year students in driver education classes had opportunity to change cars. The last they began using was a Chevrolet Citation. It was fun to drive on pretty spring days.

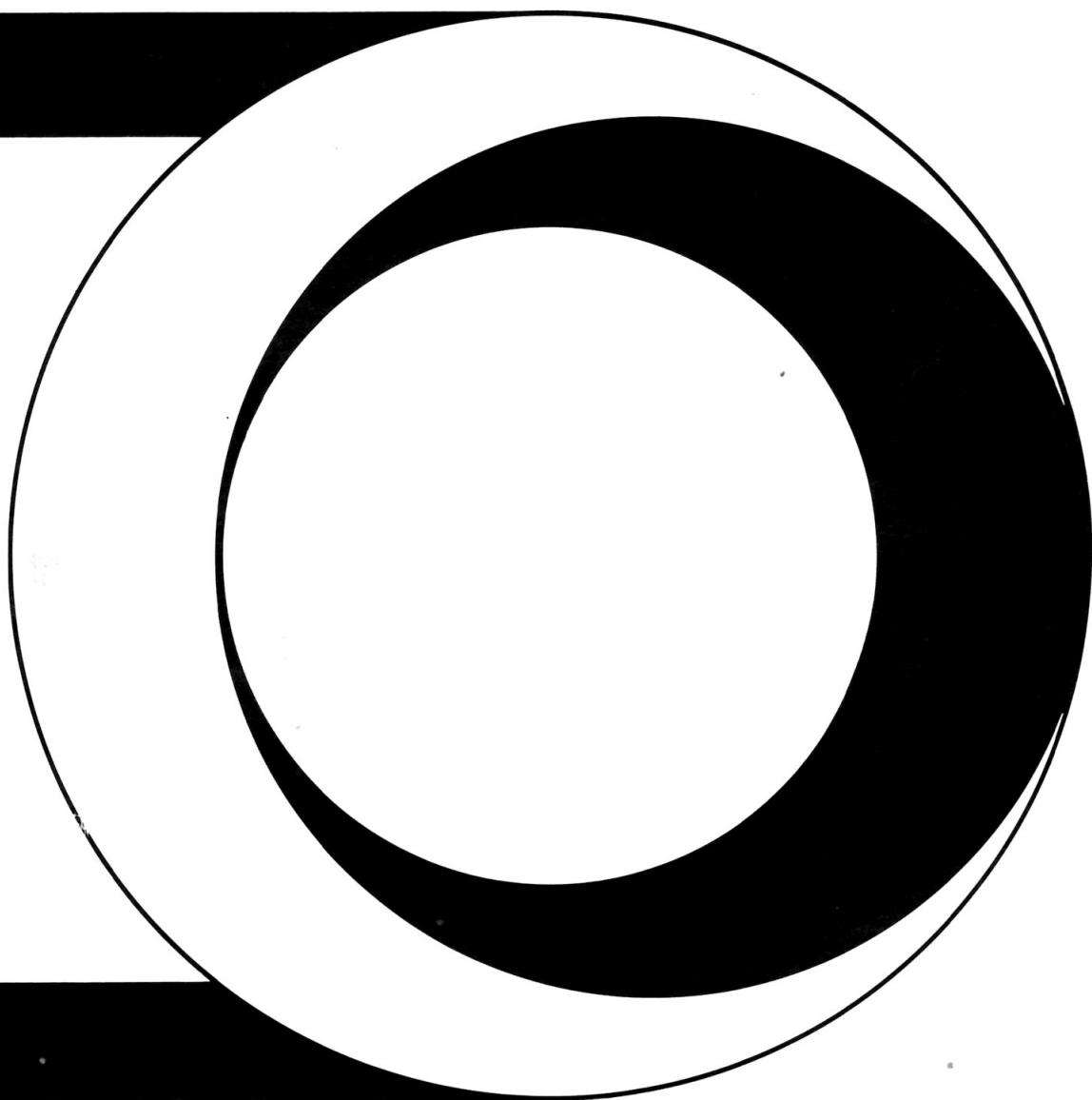

A Team to be Remembered

Ward Leads Hughes

Never underestimate the advantages of having an open date.

Hughes had an open date before it played Earle last Friday night and it gave the Blue Devils enough time to make a few offensive changes like adding an option play to its regular slot-I offense. That meant that tailback Melvin Ward was going to be an important part of the Hughes attack.

That's exactly the way it turned out as Ward rushed 20 times for 102 yards and scored two touchdowns in a performance that helped defeat Earle 25-20 and earn himself the title of Evening Times Player of the Week.

We were pleased with our offense — the way they moved the ball." Hughes coach Bill Cook said about his team's Friday night effort. "We didn't have any big plays, it was all just grind it out and we were getting five and six yards a chunk. If Ward averaged five yards a lick, that's about what he was getting every time.

"More than likely they were keying on him," Cook added. "We usually have a lot of success running on the outside and they had their linebackers moved to the outside. Our tailback usually runs more than 20 times a game but they were leaving the inside

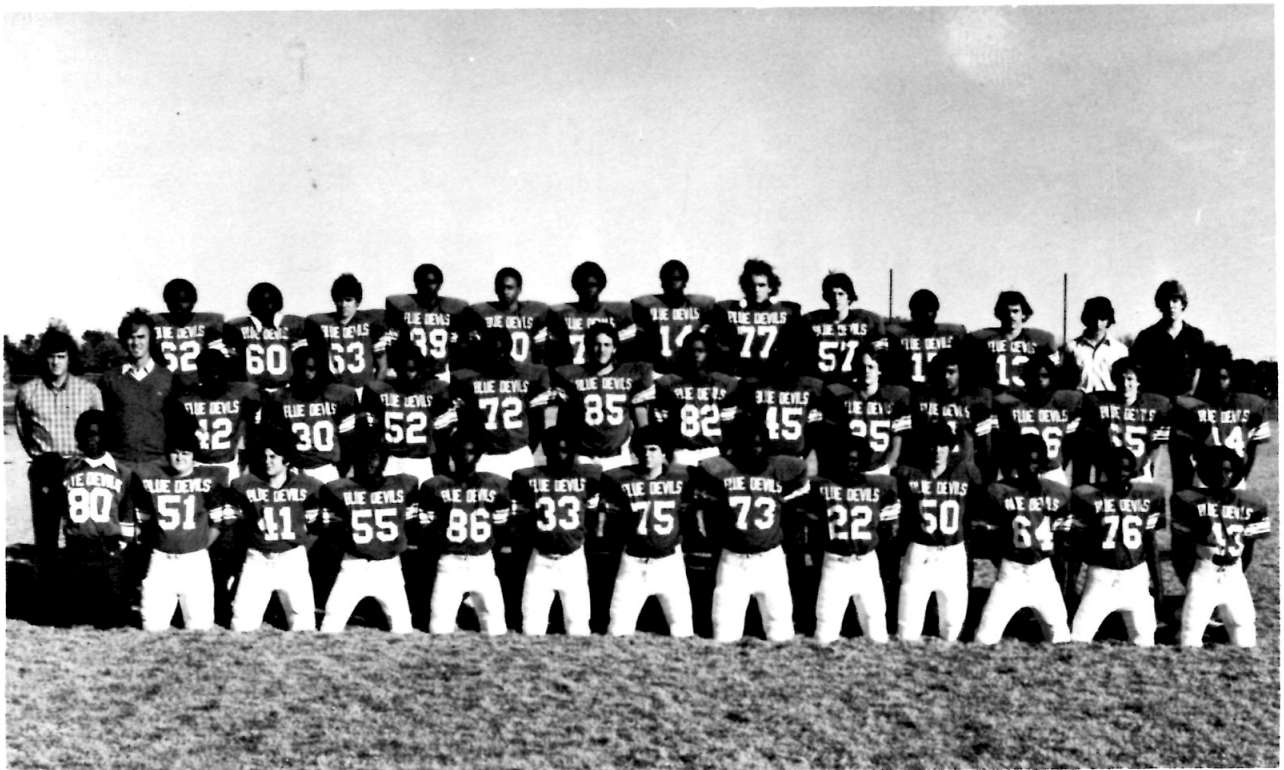
open and our fullback Tommy Childs carried 15 times and that helped open up everything."

Ward also figures that having that open date did a lot to open things up for his team Friday night.

"It was an excellent idea," Ward said. "It was a great help. When we first started out we didn't run it like we should have but on up into the week we started working on it harder and harder and finally got it pat so that it would be good in the game.

"They weren't expecting the option," Ward added, "because when we ran to the weak side and the flanker went in motion, they always thought that he was going to pitch it to the flanker but instead I'd get the ball and run off tackle and cut back behind the linebackers for about five or six yards every play."

Ward also completed one pass out of a fake-sweep for a 10-yard gain to lead to one of his TD's while on defense, he accounted for two tackles from his corner back position and also helped defuse the Earle passing attack. Ward also returned one punt in the game for 17 yards and a kick off 25 yards.
