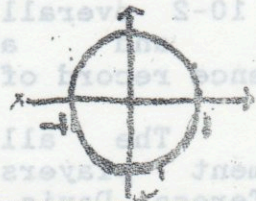
\$900 FROM HJH

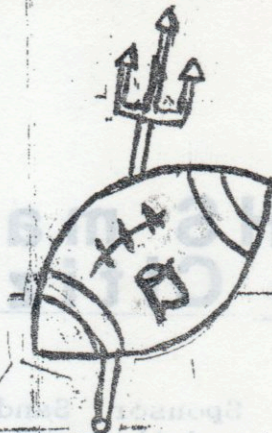

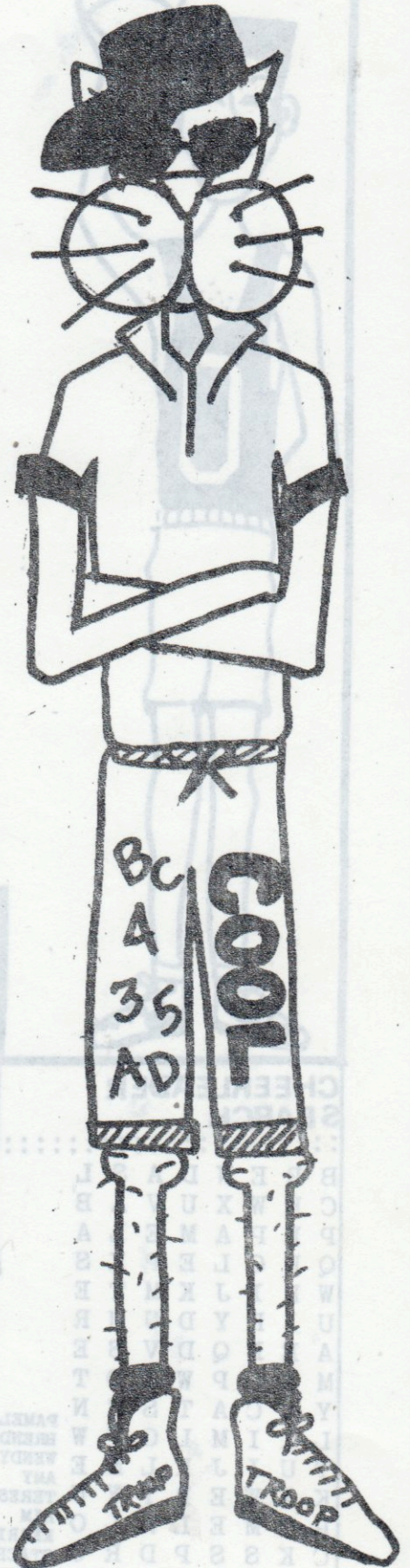

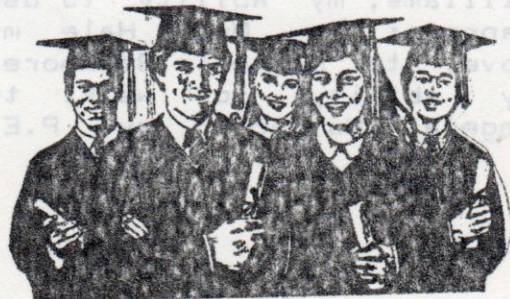
