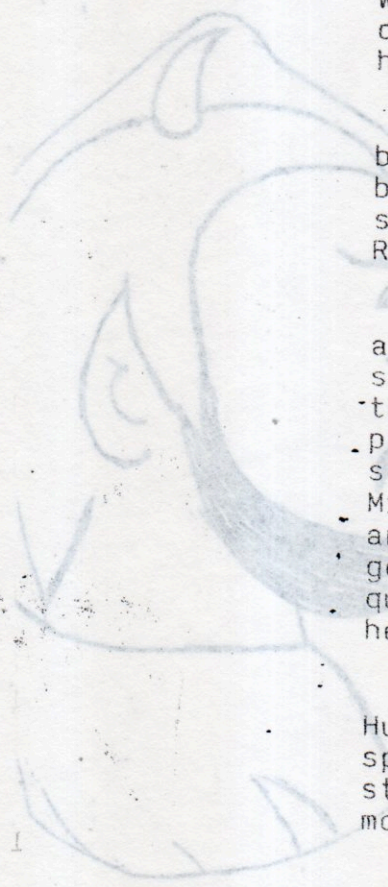
He enjoys playing tennis and baseball, fishing, watching college football, and listening to music by artists such as Cyndi Lauper, Chicago, and Lionel Richie.

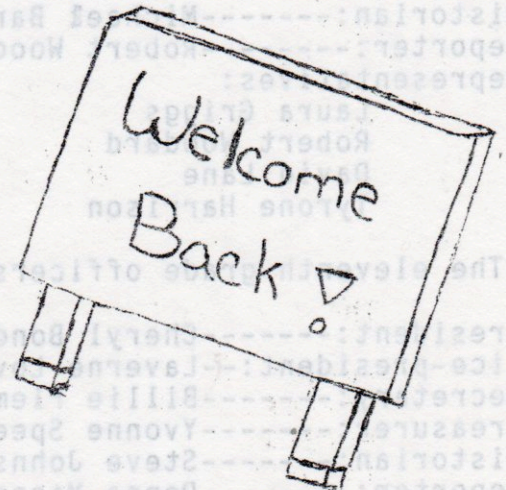

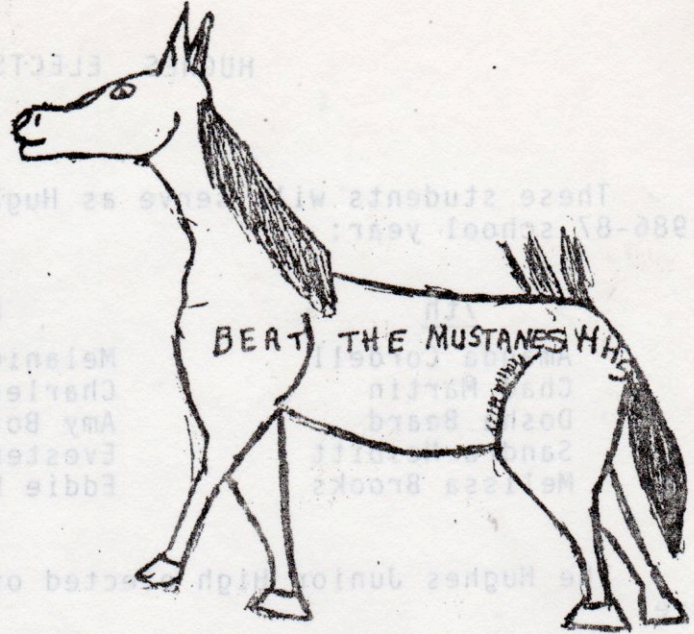

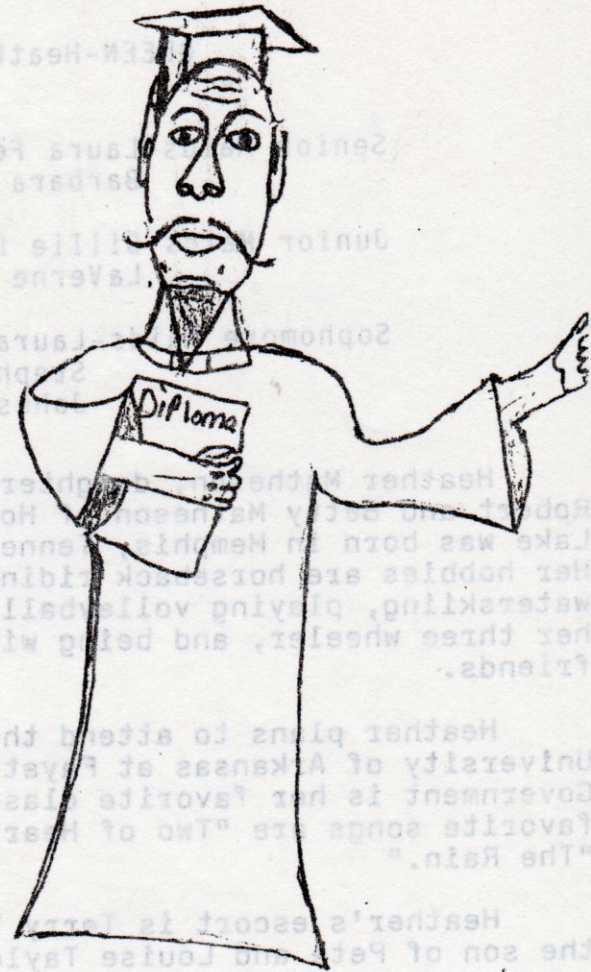
HEAR YE, HEAR YE

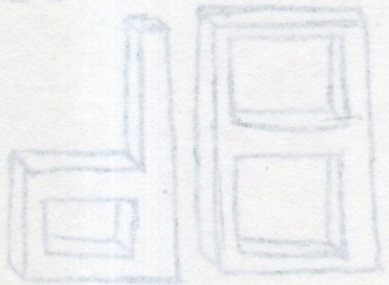
This written letter is supposed to go home to your parient's informing them about students entering kindergarten.

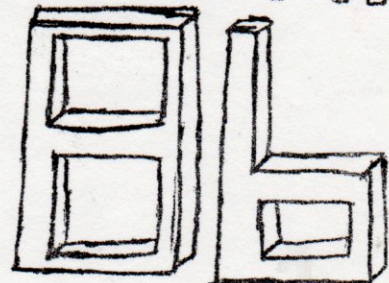

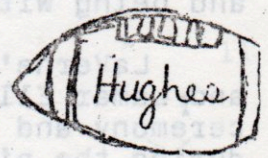
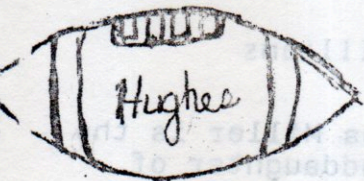

BLUE DEVILS CONTINUE TO ROLL

The Hughes Blue Devils began their season Friday, September 5, at Osceola. Out to better their last year's record of 8-4, the Blue Devils are triumphantly on their toes. This year, like every year, Hughes has some outstanding players returning to the team. They are seniors David Smith, Sylvester White, Benny Tate, Mcvey Foote, Tyler Burch, Kevin Brooks, Kevin Mooney, Craig Parker, and Terry Taylor; and juniors Kevin Nesbitt, James Reid, Smokey Long, Tony Reed, Norris Latham, Scott Kelley, Brad Hampton, Michael Owens, Mack Small, and Jeff Coats. First year players expected to contribute to the team are Deon Lee, Hosea Jackson, Lyndon Johnson, John Woodie, Gary Johnson, and Andrew Thomas.

In their season opener Friday, September 5, at Osceola, the Blue Devils edged out the Osceola Seminoles with a score of 7-0. Hughes quarterback, Mcvey Foote, scored the only touchdown of the game in the fourth quarter.

On September 12, the Blue Devils played host to the powerful Barton Bears. The Bears shut out the Blue Devils 35-0. Barton's running back, Albert Porter, mesmerized the Devil's defensive line for three touchdowns.

On September 19, the Hughes Blue Devils recovered from their loss to Barton to beat the Marion Patriots 7-6 at Marion. Hughes halfback David Smith scored the winning touchdown in the fourth quarter. Allen Latham added the extra point.
