# Faculty Focus: Robins Important To HHS

Mr. Arzell Robins, our Junior High Principal, has many qualities that go unnoticed...

Before Mr. Robins became principal, he was a head basketball coach for two years at Hughes. He also played for the St. Louis Minor Leagues for two years. Last but not least, he is a military veteran.

## School Policies Change This Year At Hughes

Many students have been asking questions such as, "Why did the attendance policy change?" "How come we have to go to the resource room all day after three tardies?"

According to High School Principal John Woodie, the attendance policy was changed to improve attendance. It seems that too many students were missing days for no apparent reason.

This year, if a student misses more than eight days during a semester, he will be in danger of failing.

The school has the right to withhold a student's credit if he has missed too many days.

Also, the tardy policy has been changed. Now, on a student's third tardy, he will go to the resource room for three whole school days instead of one class period. The next third tardy will merit a five day visit to the resource room. (continued on page 6)

# Vo-Tech Offers Wide Variety

Each day twenty-five students from HHS align auto bodies, diagnose engine repairs, shampoo hair, repair micro-miniature circuits, and study microbes and disease.

Sound strange?

These students attend Crowley's Ridge Vocational-Technical School in Forrest City.

By taking classes at the Vo-Tech, students learn about a variety of fields and gain hands-on experience.

Students planning a career in automotive repair learn how to fix and paint wrecked cars and how to make repairs to engines in the Auto Body and Auto Mechanics classes.

If a career in computers is a student's goal, he can learn how a computer works and how it can be repaired in Computer Repair.

Many Vo-Tech students are enrolled in Cosmetology. These students not only learn how to give facials, manicures and shampoos, but also see hair-cutting demonstrations in class.

Health occupations is a course for aspiring nurses which teaches students the correct methods to take blood pressure, check readings and maintain a good rapport with the patient.

The advantages of taking a class at Crowley's Ridge Vo-Tech are that students can find out if they will enjoy working in a particular field

and they can gain valuable experience.

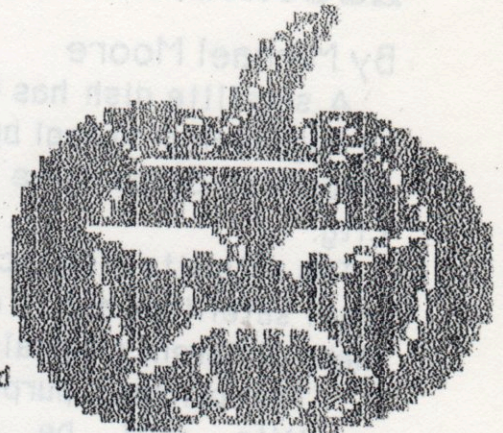
The MHS Vo-Tech students leave Hughes at 8:00 a.m. and return at 11:30 a.m.

Students are faced with many problems at school. One of them is students who come to school not to learn, but to goof off.

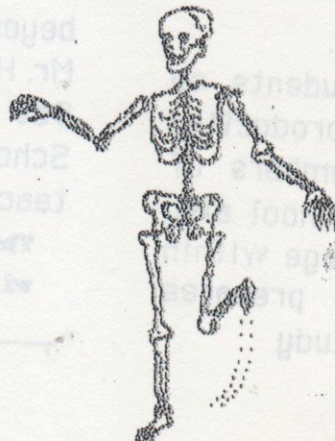
Some students come to school because their parents made them or just to eat and joke around with friends. This causes other students to lose their concentration.
