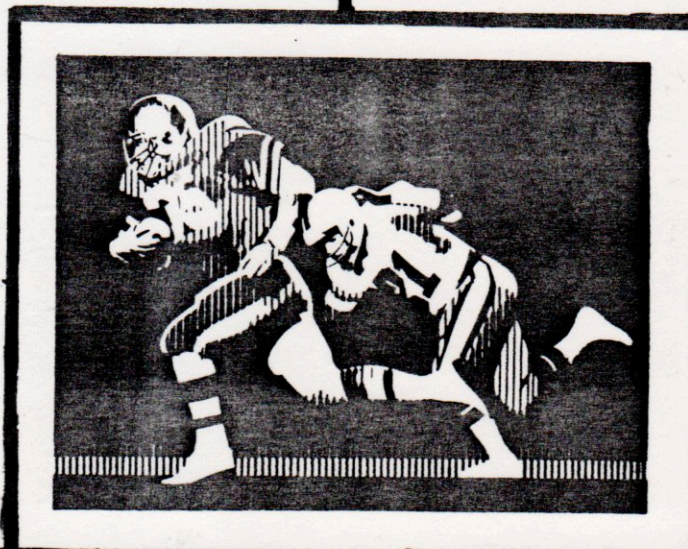
The Blue Devils improve to 4-2 on the season and 2-1 in league play. This week the Devils host the Harrisburg Hornets.

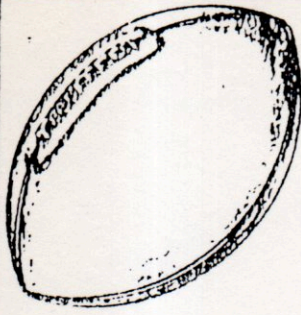


Blue Imps - 6

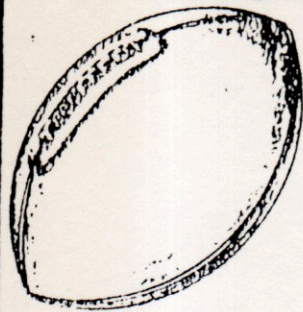
Ozell Craft scored on a

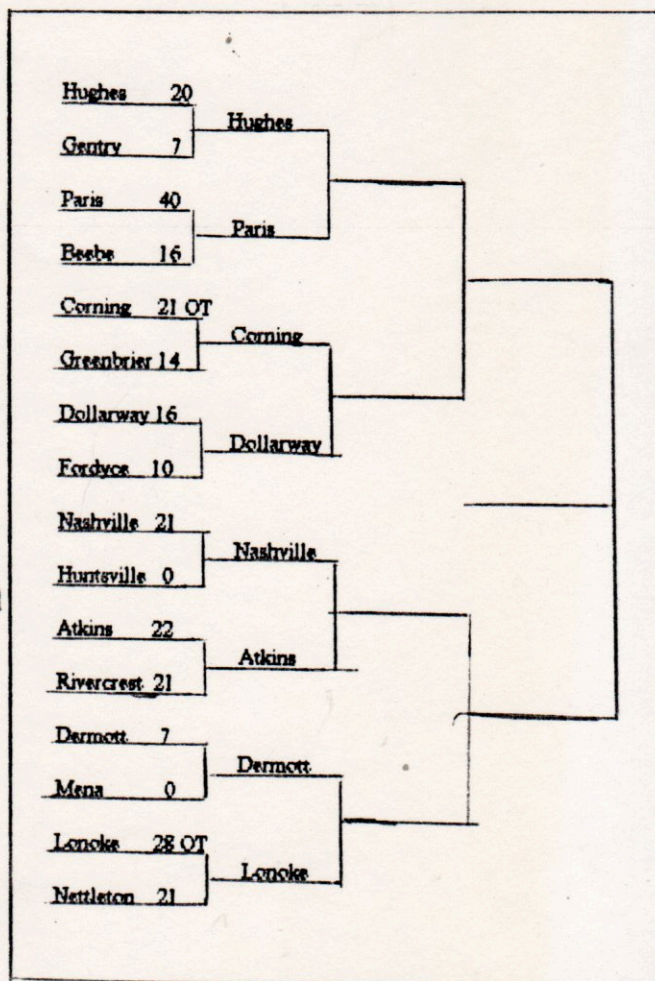

In the third quarter the Pioneers marched 68 yards for their lone score

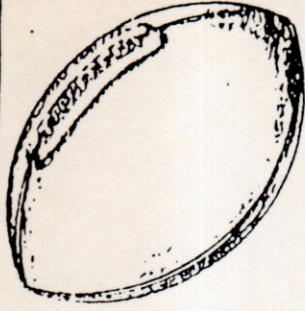

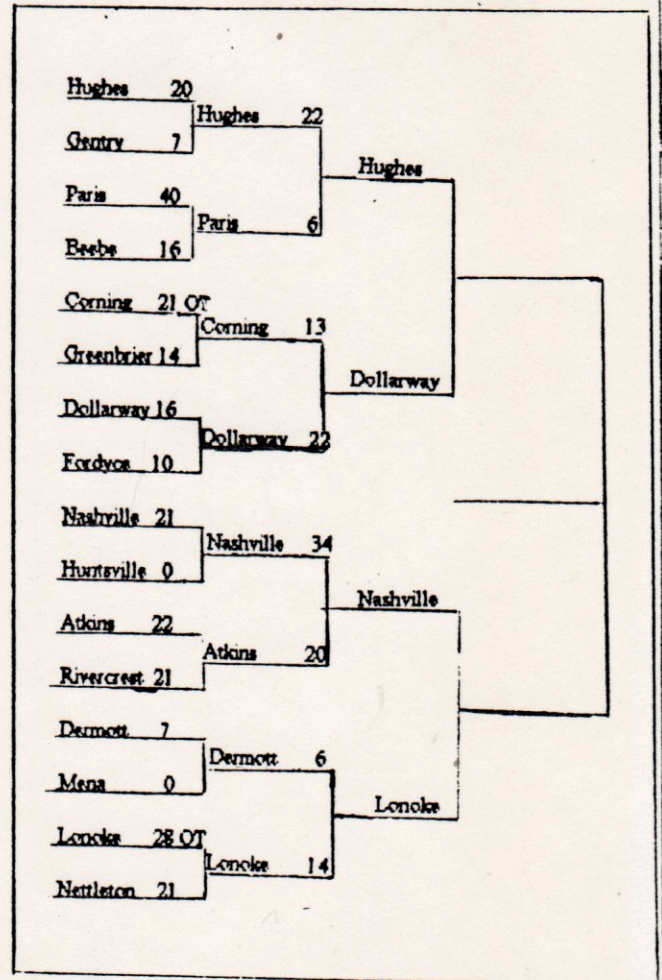

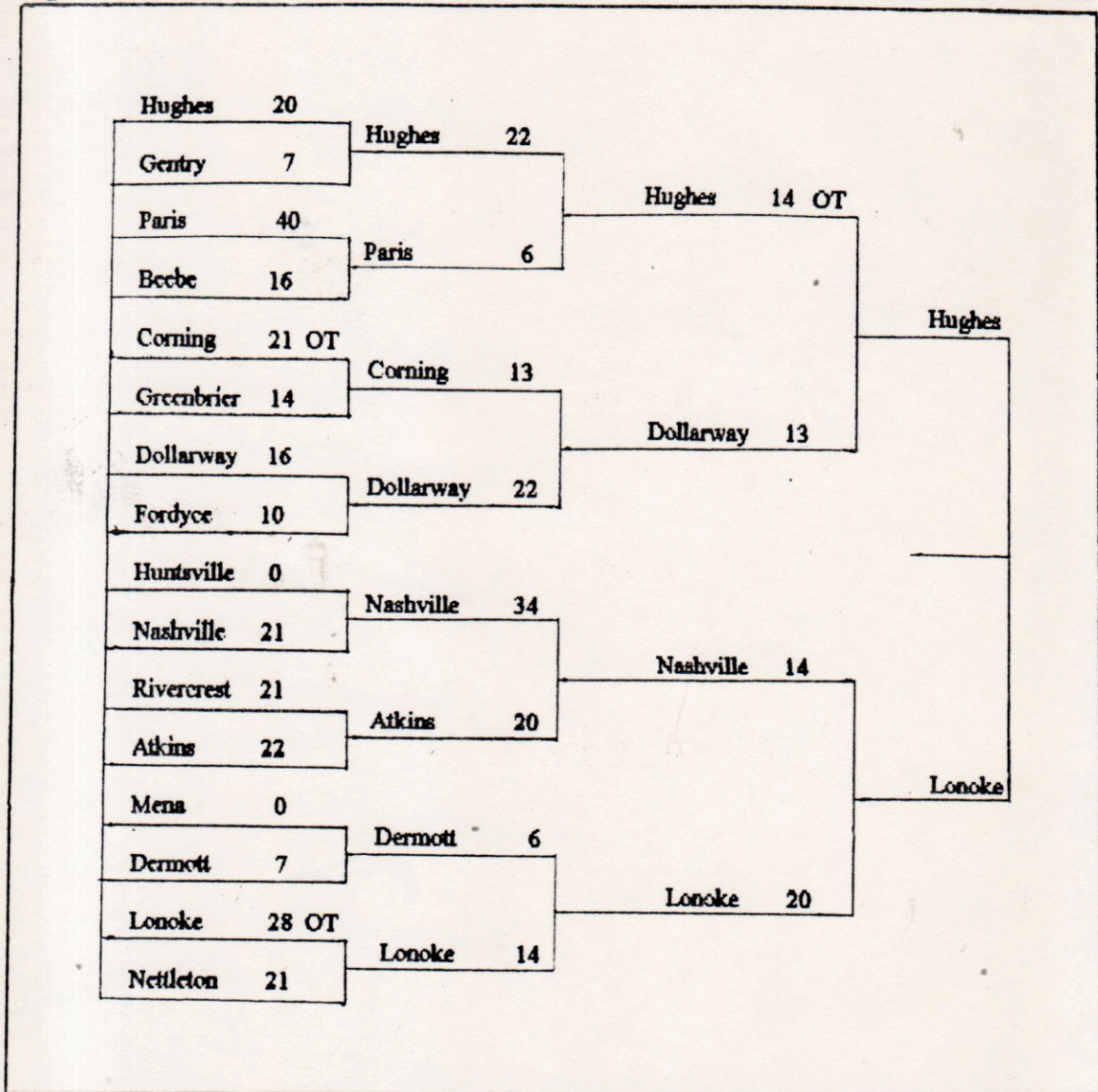
